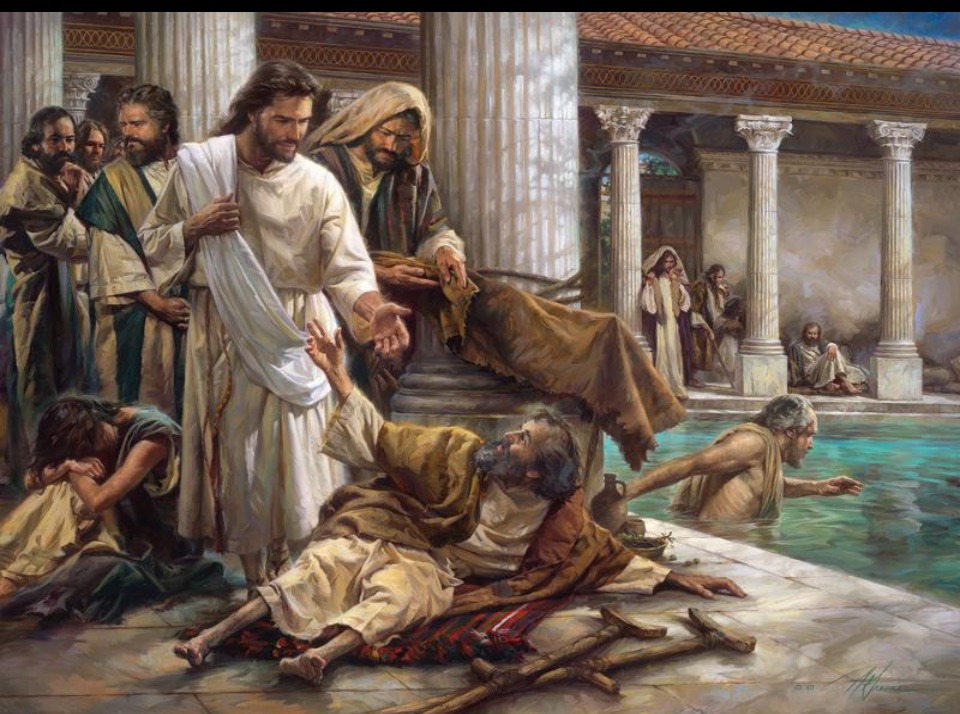

The Effects of Penance and Reconciliation

- 1. Turn away from sin and toward god*
- 2. Brings peace and a clear conscience*
- 3. Freed from eternal damnation , if confessing a mortal sin*
- 4. Must make reparation for our sins*
- 5. Our relationship with god is restored*

Question:

When to receive our first confession?

Answer:

Before receiving the sacrament of the Holy Eucharist, because we must be in the state of grace before receiving the sacrament of holy communion

Some rules on the sacrament of penance and reconciliation

- 1. Must confess your sins at least once a year*
- 2. Must confess your sins before receiving the Eucharist, if you have a mortal sin on your soul*
- 3. Must accept that we have done wrong in the eyes of god*
- 4. Must have sorrow that we have offended god*
- 5. Make a firm conviction to sin no more*
- 6. Priest cannot reveal your sins to anyone!*

Must have three main actions on the part of the penitent to completely receive the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation

- 1. Express your sorrow to god*
- 2. Examine your conscience and confess your sins to the priest*
- 3. Perform reparations for your sins*

Effects of Anointing the Sick

- 1. Unites us with the suffering of Christ*
- 2. Gives us peace to endure suffering*
- 3. It brings mental and physical health*
- 4. Helps us to accept our death and look with hope to living in God's ultimate kingdom*

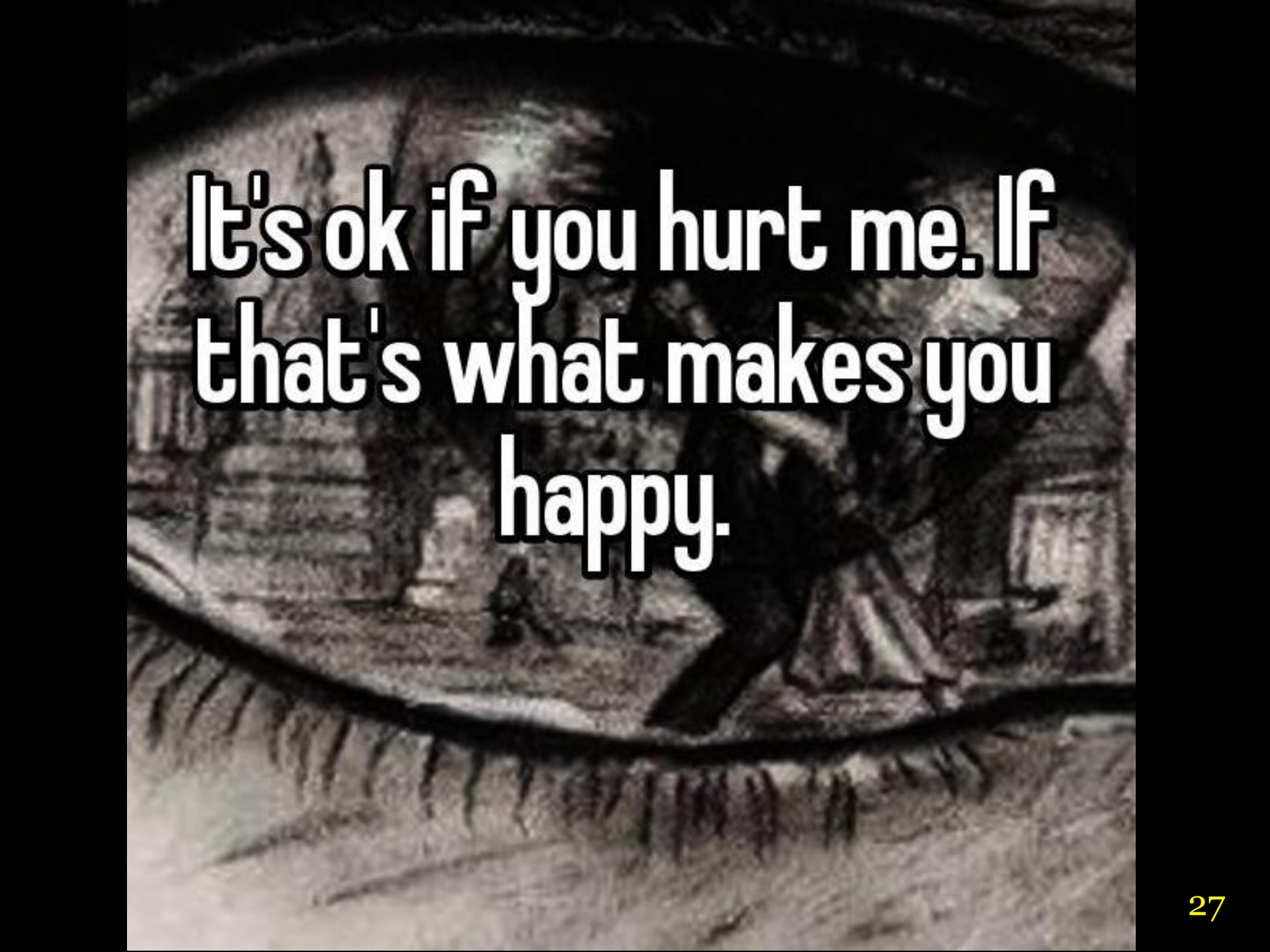
Receiving the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

- 1. If someone is on the verge of death*
- 2. If someone is very old and in poor health where it is not know how close to death they may be*

Receiving the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

- 1. Can receive this sacrament any number of times*
- 2. Only a priest can administer this sacrament*
- 3. Person is anointed on the forehead and hands with oil for this purpose*
