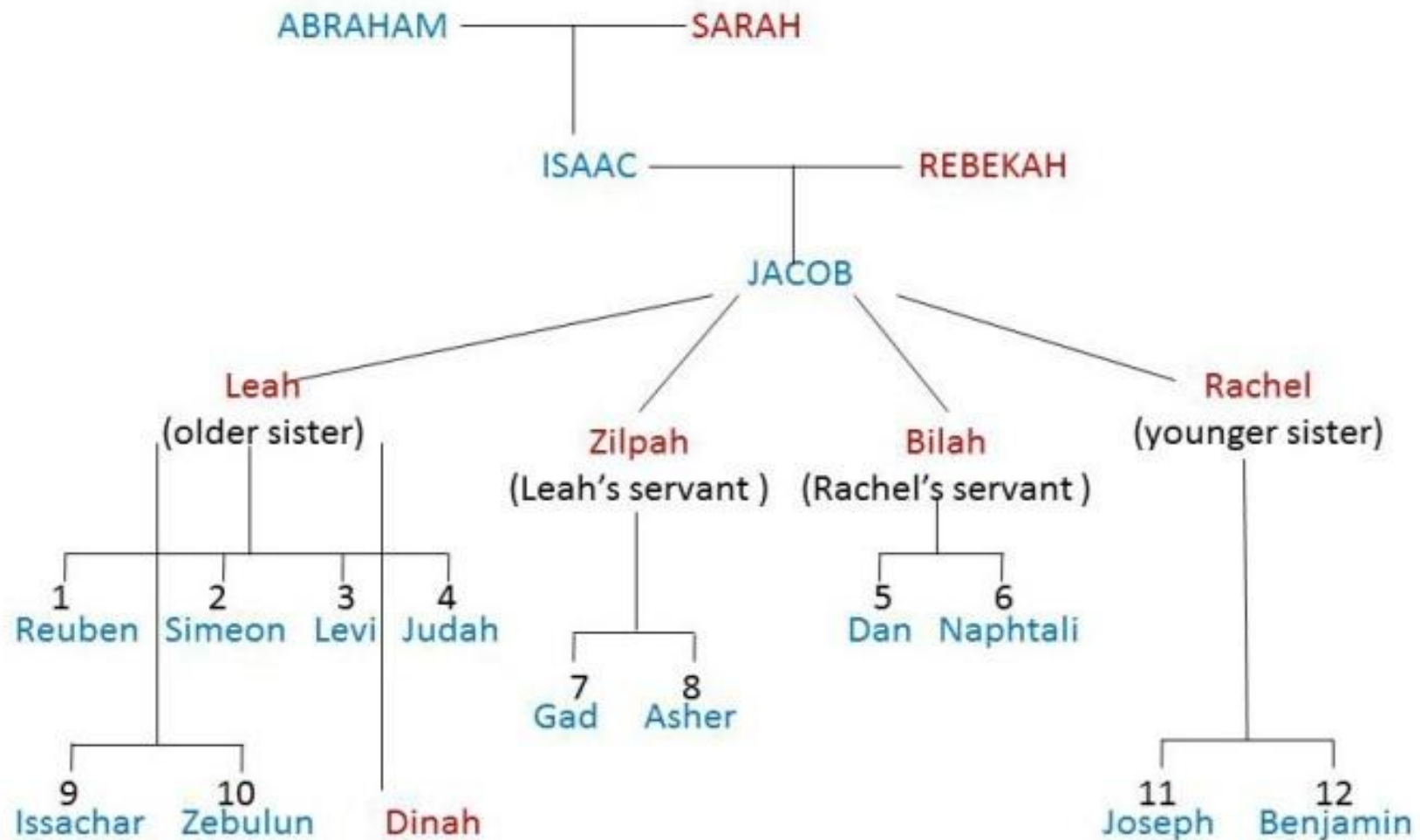




Now of the things which we have spoken

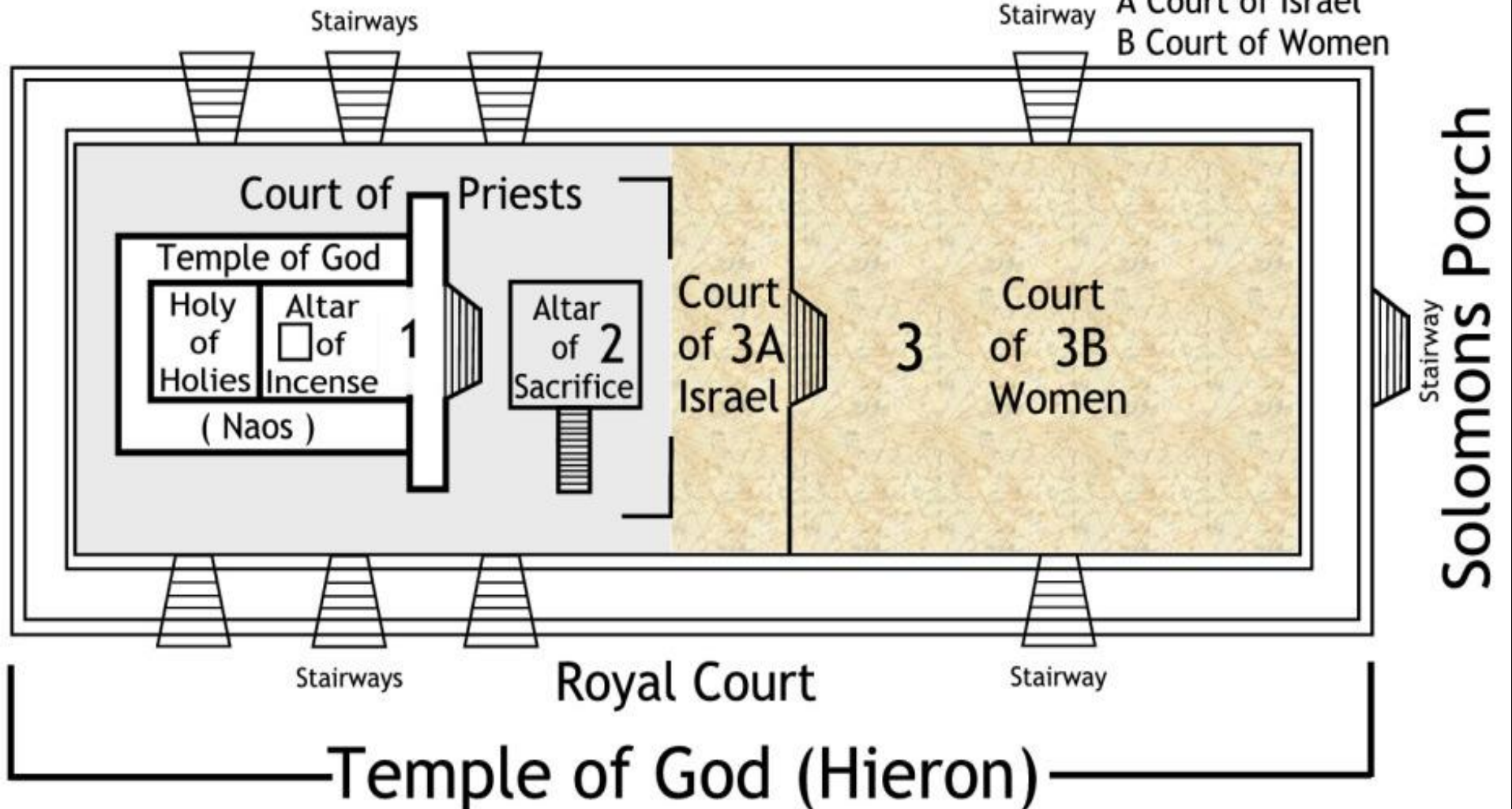
1 = Temple of God (Naos)

2 = Altar (Priests Court)

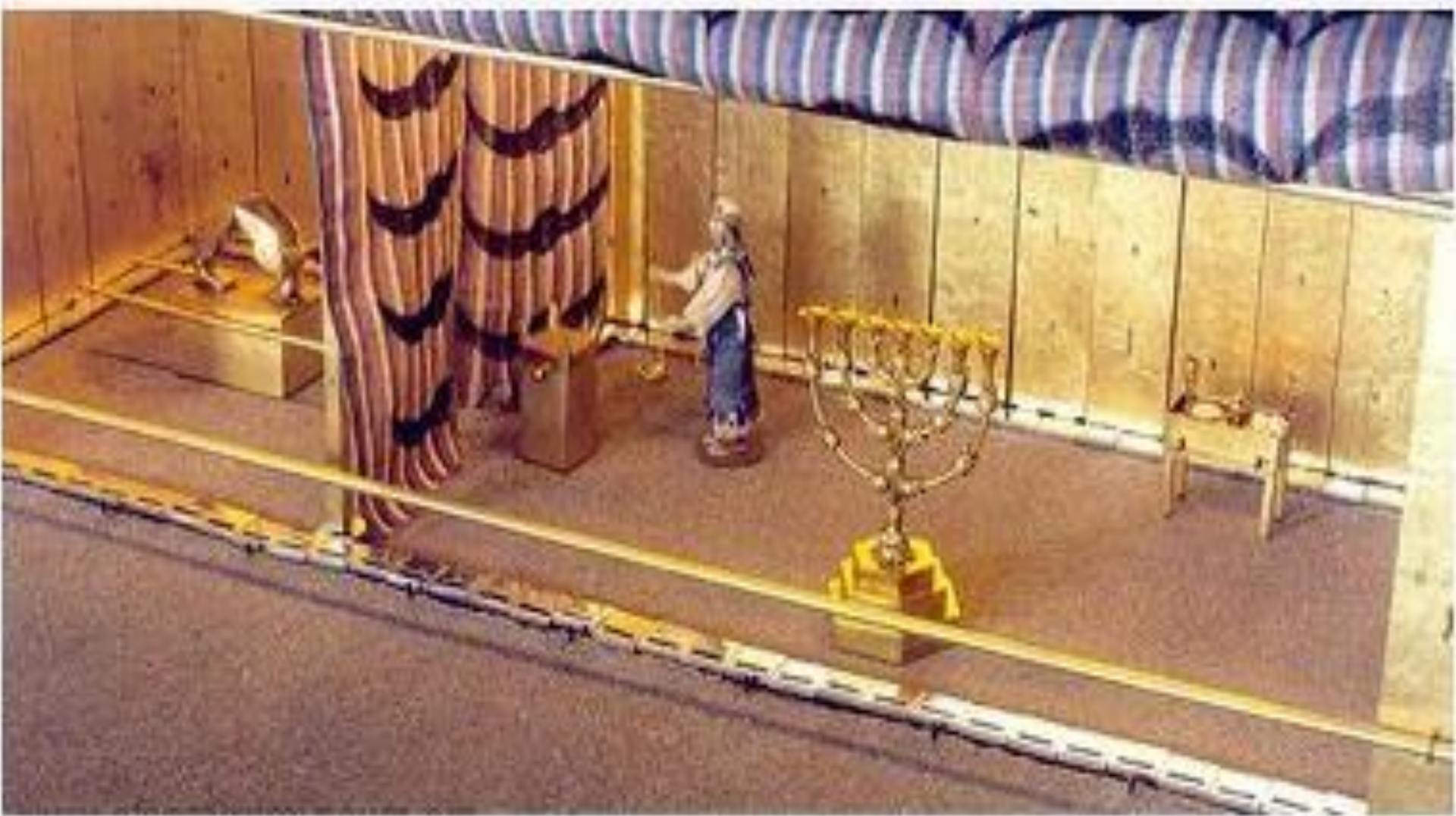
3 = Worshippers

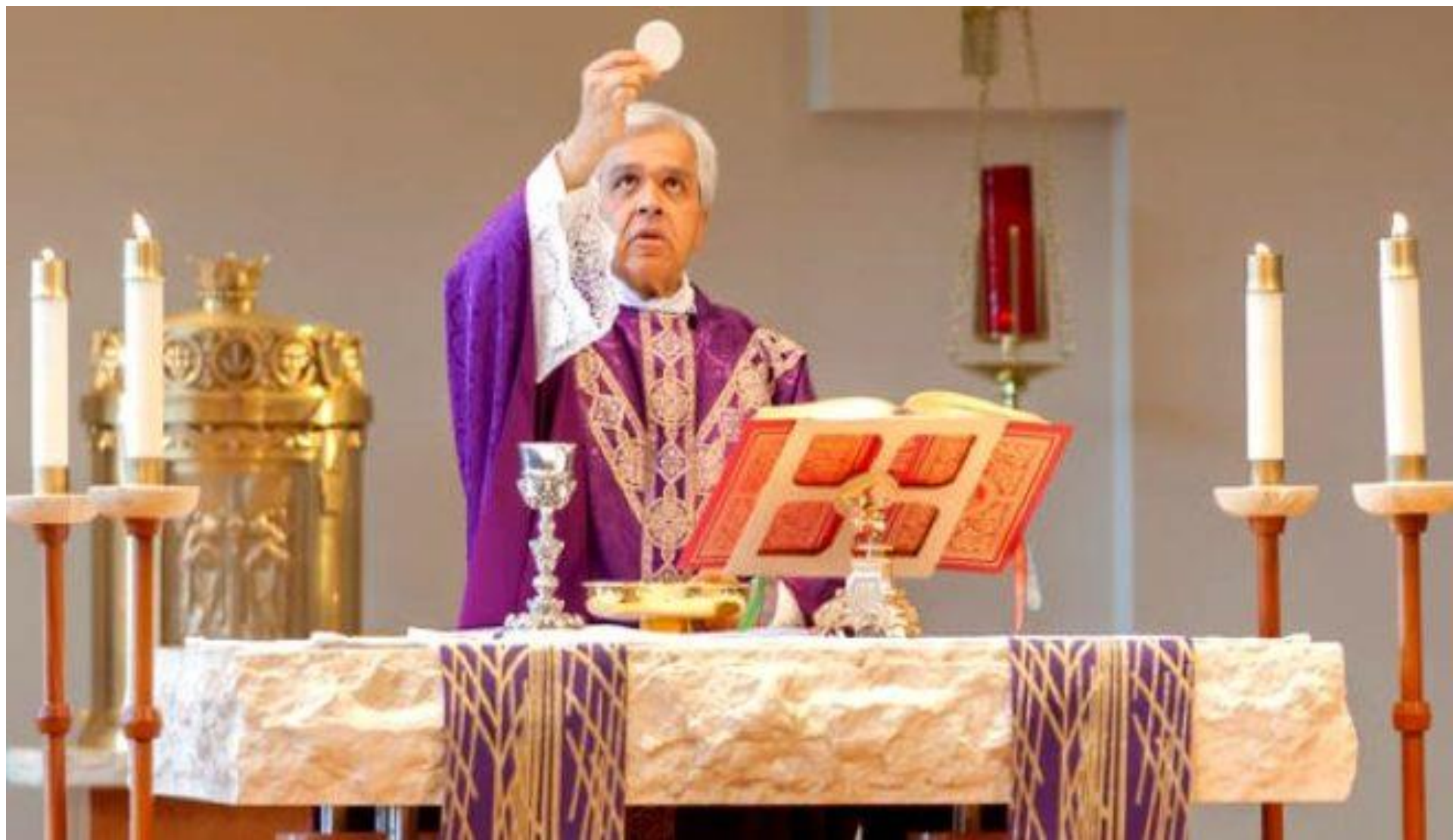

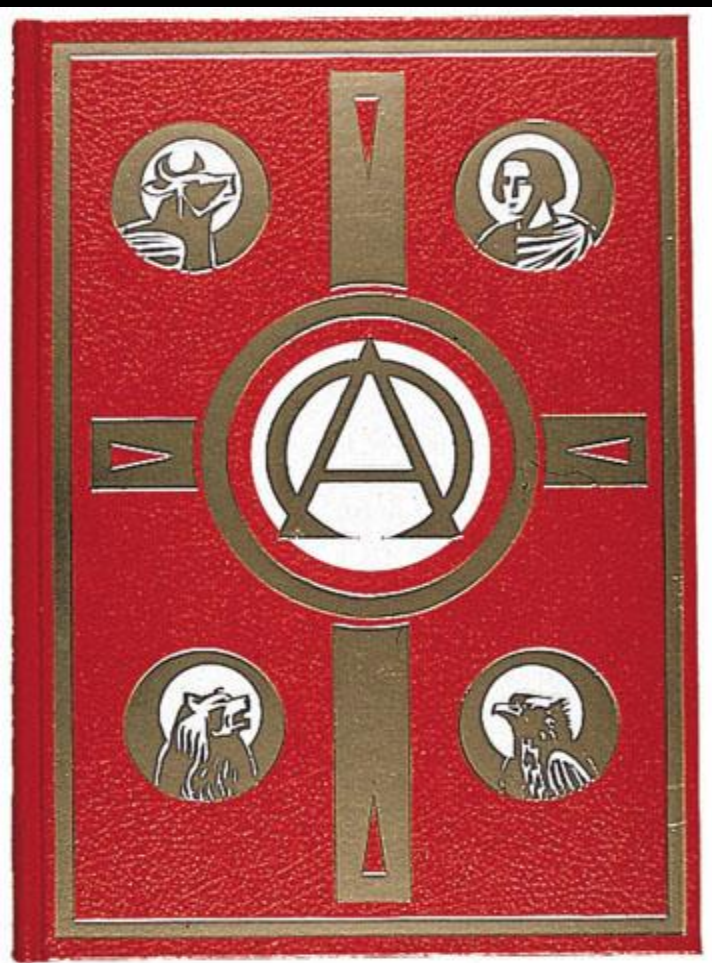




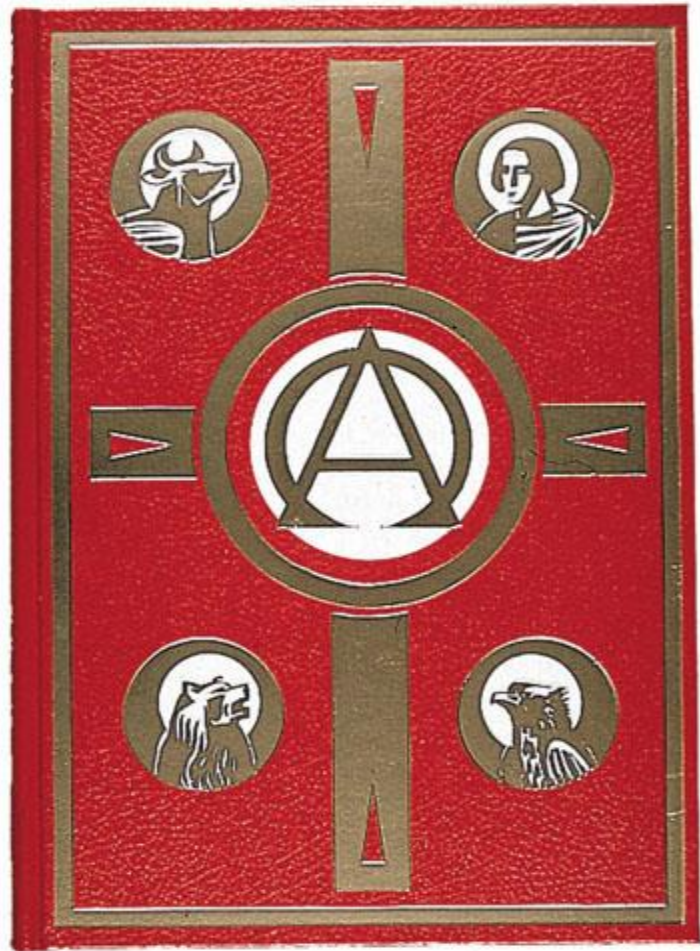












A Permanent Character

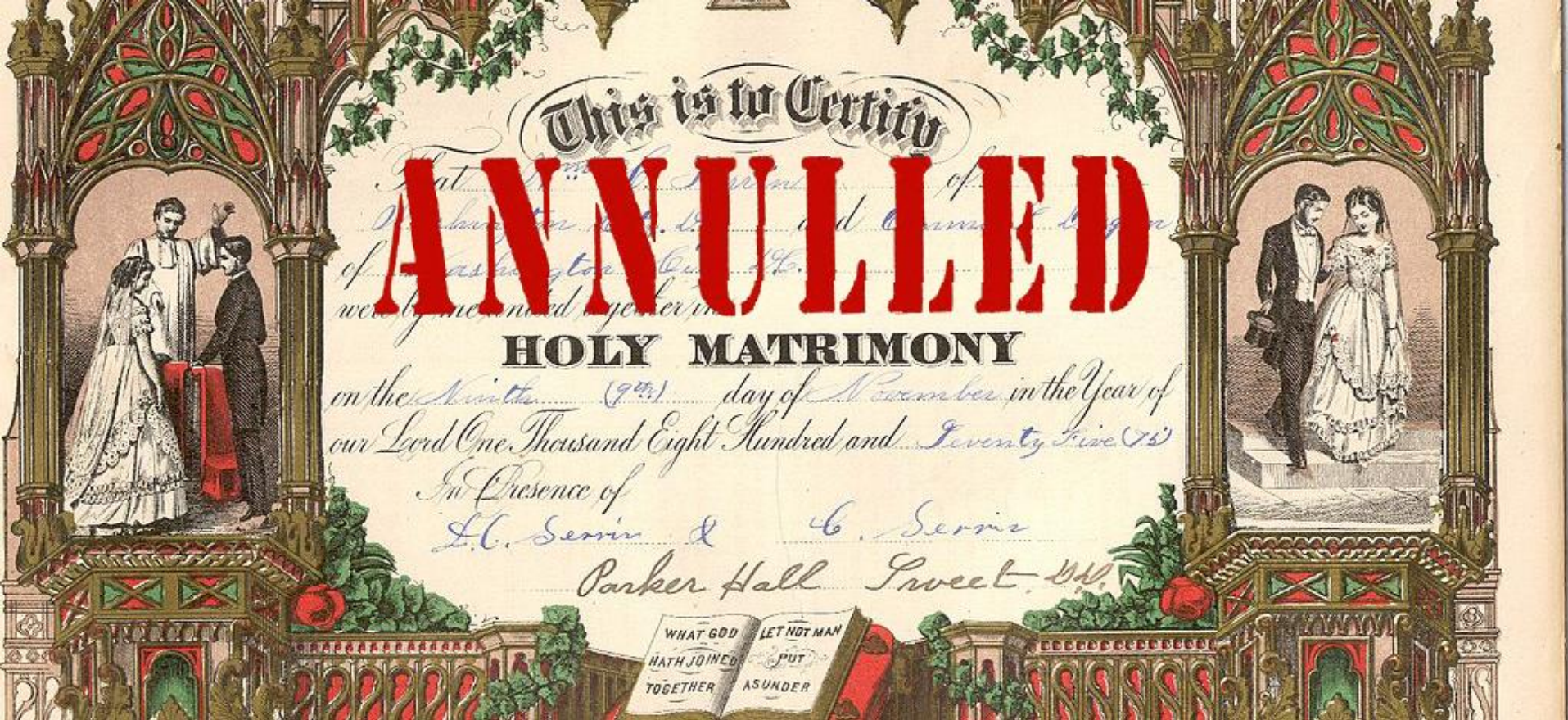
- 1. Can only receive this sacrament once*
- 2. Never lose their authority to administer other sacraments if another priest is not present*
- 3. Only men can be ordained to these ministries*
- 4. Priests and bishops remain single to devote their entire lives to this ministry*





A Meaningful Marriage

- 1. Brings unity to the two persons, no one else*
- 2. A covenant for the remainder of their lives
until death do they part*
- 3. Must be open and willing to bring new life into
God's creation*
- 4. This is why polygamy, divorce and
contraception are grave sins*
- 5. Cannot receive holy communion unless you
confess these sins and do reparation*

1. *A statement from the church saying the marriage never existed*
2. *An obstacle existed at the marriage preventing one person from freely committing to the marriage*











The Marriage Rite

- 1. Both persons give full consent to the marriage and must be baptized into the Catholic Church.*
- 2. No obstacles present like mental illness or a secret addiction.*
- 3. Must be in the church with witnesses and presided over by a priest or deacon, does not require a mass.*
- 4. It is the two persons who administer the sacrament, not the priest or deacon.*
- 5. Exchange of vows, some liturgy of the word, exchange of rings and a pronouncement by the priest or deacon.*
